

One is called to encounter and experience the love and mercy of God

YOU ARE MY WITNESSES....[ACTS 1/8]

As the Covid-19 pandemic continues to afflict us with sickness, death, fear, deprivation, and diminishment of freedom we silently enter a new Pastoral Year 2020-21 from 1st of June. The pastoral letter of our Bishop, published recently, spells out the THEME as "YOU ARE MY WITNESSES" [Acts 1/8] and in konknni "TUMI MHOJE GOVAI" [D. I. 1/8]



It is nice to know that the purpose of our life is greater than our own personal fulfilment. We are born by his purpose and for His purpose. When we ask "What do I need to be? What should I do with my life?" The focus is ME and not GOD and it is here that we fail. Because God is our starting point and source of our life. My life should be God-centered. To discover our purpose in life we must turn to God's word and not the wisdom of the world. The bible says: It's in Christ that we find out who we are and what we are living for. Long before we heard of Christ and got our hopes up, He had his eyes on us, Lord designs for us a glorious living (Ephesians 1:11-12)

We are created to become like Christ. As Ephesians 4:24 beautifully puts it. "You were created to be like God (or in likeness of God), truly righteous and Holy". Let us be absolutely clear: We will not become God or even a god. That is Satan's oldest temptation. He promised Adam and Eve that "ye shall be a God": if they followed his advice.

And we are empowered to become like GOD, to make Him present wherever we are and wherever we go and the empowering lies precisely in these words ".....When the Holy Spirit comes upon you, you will be filled with the power and you will be my witnesses" Acts 1:8

Again we find "All authority in Heaven and Earth has been given to me. Go, therefore make disciples of all the nations and baptize them in the name....and know that I am with you always, yes, to the end of time." Mt 28:17-20

But sad to say that **Great commission** has become the **great omission** in our day to day life. For most of us religion is a set of rituals and formulae, obligations and practices. Most of us are not serious about living as Jesus's Disciples, much less making others His disciples.

We, who are God's chosen people, have become God's frozen people. We are frozen in living our own complacent lives without sharing Jesus with others.

So – what do witnesses do? Witnesses share the story of what they have experienced. Witnesses for Jesus tell others what they know about him, the things that are real to them, the good news about him that they have experienced in their daily lives.

One of the first recorded Christian witnesses in the New Testament is Andrew. Andrew apparently used to hang around with John the Baptist, but one day Jesus passed by, and John pointed him out. **"Look"**, he said, **"here is the Lamb of God"** (John 1:36). Andrew and another follower of John heard him say this, and they took off after Jesus.

When Jesus turned and saw them following, he said to them, 'What are you looking for?' They said to him, 'Rabbi' (which translated means Teacher), 'where are you staying?' He said to them, 'Come and see'. They came and saw where he was staying, and they remained with him that day. So Andrew gets to spend the day with Jesus, and he's so excited about Jesus that he immediately goes and finds someone he loves – his brother Simon – and tells him about it. He's so persuasive that his brother's curiosity is aroused, and so he goes to meet Jesus too. And the rest, as they say, is history.

Finally, witnessing is not something we do; it is who we are. Thus like Paul, who said in 1 Corinthians 9 that he did everything for the sake of the salvation of others, we too should live our lives as personal witnesses of Christ, his resurrection, and everything else that he did.

So, let us labour, with prayerful confidence that God will take the gospel to those around us as we, his witnesses, fulfil our calling. May the Holy Spirit impassion us to grow as witnesses.

Psalm 71:3 Be my rock of refuge, to which I can always go; give the command to save me, for you are my rock and my fortress.



CALLED TO BE AN AUTHENTIC WITNESS OF OUR FAITH

The theme for the New Pastoral Year is, "You Are My Witnesses". The theme of this pastoral year invites every member of the Archdiocese of Goa to examine our relationship with God and how we witness our experience of God's love to our brothers and sisters, through our words, actions and attitudes. To the modern world a "witness" is commonly understood as someone who testifies on behalf of a person or to an event that he or she has seen with their own eyes or for which the person has first-hand knowledge. This is common understanding of serving as a witness in court. Such witness is meant to establish the truth, so that a proper judgement can be rendered by the appropriate authority.

As for us, the followers of Christ, we are called to serve as witnesses to God that we believe in. To serve as a witness to our God means to demonstrate by our words, actions and attitudes, the sacred mystery which, we have seen, heard and believe in our heart about our God, who has forgiven us of our sins and offered us eternal life through Jesus Christ. In order to see, hear and believe the sacred mystery, we need to strengthen our relationship with God, who alone can direct us on the right path. The strengthening of our relationship with God happens, only when we give time to Him in prayer and listen to what God has to say to us. Spending time with God and listen to Him will help us to have an experience of God, who loves us unconditionally. This experience will lead us to gratitude and gratitude will lead us to bear witness to God's goodness towards us.

Our witness to God is not by giving testimony to the facts but more so to the truth; truth that is not always visible or provable by modern standards. We give testimony to what we have seen in our heart and not necessarily what we have seen with our physical eyes. We testify to our faith more effectively through our actions rather than through our words, inviting people not simply to understand what we are saying but to meet the Lord personally and powerfully through our own faith, hope and love in God.

Pope Francis in one of his homilies regarding Christian witness cautions us about the danger of self-promotion when he says, "Christian witness is meant to edify others and not to serve as a path to self-promotion". The temptation of working towards self-glory or self-promotion is real and we have ample of examples in the history of the Church. When our focus is more on promoting self rather the God, we fail to become the authentic witnesses of God that we believe to others. This temptation of self-glory can be overcome by the virtue of humility. Pope Francis puts it clearly when he says, "Christian witness must be grounded in humility

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which is being a simple salt and light for others". We all know the importance of salt and light in out day today life and yet there is not much attention given to it. The highest form of humility is seen in Jesus himself. We as followers of Jesus are called to practice the humility of Jesus in our day today life in order to become true witnesses of God before others.

Throughout this pastoral year, we will have ample of opportunities to examine our relationship with God, our experience of God's unconditional love for us and our intentions in giving witness to this unconditional love of God for all through our words, actions and attitudes. It is this examination of our relationship and our intention that will help us to understand our discipleship of Jesus and become more authentic witnesses of our faith before others. Let us pray that God may give us His grace, to be faithful to our vocation as followers of Jesus and give true witnesses of our faith our words, actions and attitudes.

Ghor bhurgeanchem poilem iskol zhoim tim aplea avoy-bapai koddchean borim totvam xiktat. Avoy-bapui bhurgeanchim poilim xikxokam, tim aplea bhurgeank bore dekhin ani rit-rivixen vaddoitat. QUESTIONS CHILDREN ASK ABOUT THE BIBLE

Children love to ask questions. Most parents could spend hours telling about the continual streams of questions that flow from theirs children's mouths, especially the persistent, "Why?". When a child asks a question, he or she needs to be heard seriously. This is especially true in the spiritual area. It would be a grave mistake for a parent to leave a child's question unanswered. Keeping this in mind we are opening this children's page to do the needful.

12) How can kids study the Bible?

Studying the Bible is not as difficult as it may sound. In fact, it can be fun! First, start out by just reading the Bible. Read short portions—a paragraph or story—and read it in a translation you understand. Second, ask a parent to explain big words to you that you don't understand. Third, memorize verses that tell you what you should do. As you read and study, you will have questions about what the Bible means. Save your questions and find someone to answer them, like a parent, teacher, or pastor. It's good to read the Bible every day. Make it a habit.

13) What's a Concordance?

A concordance is an index of words in the Bible. It lists the words that appear in the Bible all the verses where those words appear. Many study Bibles include a concordance in the back. If you know part of a verse but don't know where to find it in the Bible, you can look up one of the verse's words in the concordance, and it'll tell you where the word is used. For example, if you want to find the verse, "God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son. Anyone who believes in him will not die but have eternal life," you could look up the word believes in the concordance. It would tell you all the places where believes is used, and you could see if any of them is the one you're looking for. For practice, see if you can find it now!

14) Why is the Bible in the two parts instead of one?

The Bible has two main parts: the Old Testament and the New Testament. The Old Testament tells the story of the beginning of the world and the beginning of the nation of Israel, it also tells about how the people of Israel obeyed and disobeyed God over many, many years. All of the stories and messages from God in the Old Testament lead up to Jesus Christ. The New Testament tells the story of Christ, the early Christians, and the future. You can think of the Old Testament and New Testament as "before Christ" and "after Christ," or as volume 1 and volume 2. Old doesn't mean out-of-date—it means that it happened before Jesus. But remember, even though the Bible has two main parts, it is all one book—God's book.

15) What is Bible's biggest story?

The Bible's biggest story is the story of Jesus. In fact, the whole Bible tells his story—about God creating people and saving them from sin. Jesus came to the world to die in our place, to pay the penalty for our sins. If we trust in Christ as Savior, God gives us eternal life. The Old Testament Bible writers told us that Jesus would be born, live, die, and rise again. Even the sacrifices described in the book of Leviticus show us what the death of Christ would be, the perfect "Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world." No matter where you look in the Bible, you can learn about Jesus. Have you put your faith in him?
